# INFORMATION SHEET INTRODUCING STARF 20

You will be aware that due to macro-economic factors affecting the world and the UK, families across the UK are struggling with many kinds of hardship including financial and mental health. You may not be aware of the extent of such hardships within our local area of Ringwood and Fordingbridge are affecting families.

We are seeking 20 businesses to join us as inaugural members of STARF 20.

## What is the problem?

We are seeing financial hardship cases that are quite distressing – in one local school 30% of families are unable to cope on the money they have.

On average 5 children in every classroom have probable mental health issues and the government service has a waiting list of over one year - however, many do not meet the criteria for that service and have no available support. A report in 2022 identified that 2/3rds of children with a diagnosable mental health condition are unable to access NHS care.

# Stronger Together Across Ringwood & Fordingbridge - is a solution

At the instigation of a local business, Empower Energy, who became aware of these issues, STARF was founded and has enjoyed support from the Ringwood & Fordingbridge Business Community group and others over the last 18 months. STARF has provided £75,000 of short-term financial support and in addition to this, is funding a School Hardship Worker (£30k) and Counselling (£50k) and other initiatives as part of our longer-term education and support, that has started to make a difference.

Some of the key points about STARF and how we are attempting to address the problem are:

- All help and support is delivered through the 8 state schools in our area we believe the schools are best placed to identify these needs where children are most affected
- Counselling, support, and education is provided by qualified professionals who are funded by STARF
- There are no admin expenses incurred out of your donations made any donations are directed towards those in need. STARF is wholly administered by volunteers

We have anonymised case studies and testimonials describing how our financial aid and counselling has impacted people's lives; and we track the value created through our Schools Hardship Worker – see our website www.STARF.uk

STARF was founded because a local business wanted to help families in need and our approach to fundraising is consistent with that. We are here to provide a channel for your generosity and support any fundraising ideas you may have. We would value the opportunity to talk to you about our work and approach.

We recognise that there are many charitable causes and needs that are seeking your funding. STARF is about local families in need - and that need has never been greater than it is now. We think focusing on local needs now is a good thing.

## Our budget

STARF has a budget of £180,000 per year including funding of a School Hardship worker, a Counselling team and we are looking to provide a Debt Coach as well as discretionary direct financial support to families. These are regular and ongoing financial commitments. We have visibility of approximately £100,000 through continued support from our founding sponsor, grants from other organisations and donations from individuals (some of which is ad hoc). We therefore have a funding gap of approximately £80,000 per year.

#### What are we looking for?

Our expenditure represents ongoing commitments mainly to people providing regular services. We therefore need some element of our funding to be secure. Thus, we are looking to identify 20 local businesses (or groups) in, or with connections in, the Ringwood and Fordingbridge area who would be willing to adopt STARF and be an advocate and supporter for our work. The form of support will vary from business to business - some may choose to make a straight donation whereas others would seek to promote STARF to its customers and business partners or encourage charitable efforts of employees.

By way of example, our founding sponsor operates a scheme whereby customers are asked to make a donation and the company matches that donation.

There is no financial commitment; only a promise to try to help us achieve our goals.
